Minor Requirements

- Open to students in any major
- HUMRTS 101 Crossdisciplinary Perspectives on Human Rights Theory and Practice (4 units)
- HUMRTS 199 Human Rights Capstone (3-5 units)*
- 25 total units of human rights-related course work across three streams — foundations, contemporary issues, and practice

*The capstone allows students to explore a human rights theme of their choice, either through a traditional research paper or a project, for example, prototyping a tool with practical application for a human rights problem, or engaging in a creative work in art, performance, or literature
