
## Human Rights Summer Fellowships





The Handa Center offers several paid summer fellowship opportunities for students interested in human rights and international justice, in collaboration with campus partners such as the Stanford Global Studies Division and the Haas Center for Public Service. Placements ensure students have meaningful, applied research and work opportunities to inform their studies and future career pathways.

Internship and fellowship placements are a key component of the Handa Center's efforts to complement classroom teachings with practical training and career guidance for students interested in protecting and promoting human rights.

Stipends of up to \$7,000 are available to students who work full-time for a minimum of nine weeks during the summer quarter. Applications are due in early February and placements qualify for Cardinal Quarter.

The **Human Rights Summer Fellowships** offer students the opportunity to make a valuable contribution to the field by addressing a pressing local challenge or effecting positive social change. Students select the summer experience that best fits their needs—either connecting with an organization of their choosing for relevant professional experience, or spending the summer engaging in community-based research. The Center can work with students to cement their placements based on discrete thematic or geographic preferences.



The **Stanford Global Studies Internship Program** places students in Phnom Penh, Cambodia, where they contribute to Handa Center research and transitional justice programs in partnership with international and Cambodian NGOs. The exact nature of placements varies from year to year, but interns typically do work related to proceedings at the Extraordinary Chambers in the Courts of Cambodia as well as working on curation and public outreach at the Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum.

The **Children's Rights Brazil Summer Fellowships** allows students to spend the summer in Brazil working on children's rights with a local partner of their own choosing. Students are asked to partner directly with a governmental, multilateral, or non-profit organization, or the corporate social responsibility wing of a for-profit business to work on promotion, monitoring, evaluation, or implementation of children's rights.
